The greatest gift we can share with our children is the love of reading! We want to do everything we can to help your child to read– and we will. But if you help us, your child will do really well. Simply put, children who read the most at home surpass the educational success of their peers who do not read at home--*even those who are hard-working, capable students.*

We are very excited to announce a partnership between the Manchester School District and the Manchester City Library to promote reading with a Winter Reading Program for elementary, middle, and high school students.

The Winter Fest Reading Program record is set up as a Monopoly game board. For every task the student completes, they will record the title on the tracking form on the back of the Bookopoly game board. The Challenge tasks on the game board list four Winter Fest programs that are happening around Manchester.

The program will begin, February 23rd and run through March 23rd, 2018. Once the student has completed his or her reading record, it can be dropped off at Manchester City Library locations or at school libraries up until March 26th, 2018. At that time, they will be given a reading incentive from local businesses.

Thank you in advance for your support and participation in the Winter Reading Program. We hope that you and your family enjoy the holiday break.







